As flagged up in the notices on Sunday, Ade has proposed that for 2021 and our Bible studies – particularly on Wednesday evening, we share a **BibleProject** initiative that will allow us both to read through the bible in a year (if we stick to the schedule) and gain insights into both the Bible's structure and its principles and teachings.

The **BibleProject** is based in the USA and will provide us collectively, or individually if you prefer, both daily readings and access to other resources like video and audio podcasts and reflections to both inform and challenge us. The support of the **BibleProject** framework may also mean that other leaders from amongst us can share some of the workload – particularly for our mid-week sessions.

As I indicated in the notices, it will also mean that if for any reason we are not able to meet “online” the program need not be interrupted – the main work we can do as individuals or families. When we are perhaps able to meet again face-to-face, the materials will still be relevant in supporting our collective learning and shared thinking and understanding about the Bible.

This first week we begin with Genesis, a few chapters each day and a psalm and a video if you wish:
